Zanzibar is an archipelago about 25 miles off the coast of Tanzania and boasts some of the most pristine beaches along the Indian Ocean. Known as the Spice Island, Zanzibar is home to many spice plantations, where visitors can discover the fresh scents of cardamom, nutmeg and more. Stone Town, the main city on Zanzibar, is rich in history and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
